It was a loss to me when she could no longer make that trip. Mom was watching the kids and cooking dinner which was not quite ready yet, I think it was Ziti and sausage. Mom responded by threatening her boys with a wooden spoon in the kitchen, and a "Watch it" remark with Mom's all business tone to go with it. We all started jumping in with various Hop Sing remarks, and finally we decided we were going to get her a camp cook T shirt that said Hop Sing on it. Mom was an excellent cook and she taught me a lot of things in the twenty years I was privileged to know her, and one of the most important was not to sweat the little stuff.
