

Maj. Leo V. Kelly Jr. December 8, 1946 - June 24, 2015

Maj. Leo V. Kelly, U.S. Army, Ret., 68, passed away at his home in Benicia following a long illness. He was born in Toledo, Ohio. He earned his Bachelors degree from University of San Francisco and enjoyed photography, modeling, fishing and spending time with his family. He was a member of Lighthouse Covenant Fellowship and for more than 25 years owned and operated LEM Fashions, a custom tailoring business geared towards men's fashions.

Prior to being a tailor, Leo served in the United States Army, completing a tour in Vietnam after being drafted into the military at the age of 18. He continued his career in the Army, serving 8 years active duty and retiring as a Major in the Army Reserves. He served his country for more than 20 years. Following is discharge Leo worked for the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Department as a Deputy for 30 years before retiring in 2005.

Leo is survived by his wife Diane Bonanno-Kelly; children Leo (Veronica) Kelly III, Elisa (Andre) Tarrell, Michael Kelly and Rebekah Kelly and 6 grandchildren. Also survived by his mother Florine Kelly; and his siblings, brother Kevin Kelly, sisters Marva Dozier, Sherry Kelly, Deborah Smith and Grace Barnes. Leo was preceded in death by his father Leo Kelly Sr. and his brother Michael Kelly.

Funeral services will be held 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at Passalacqua Funeral Chapel. Burial with full military honors will follow in Sacramento Valley National Cemetery. Family prefers donations to Hospice of the East Bay.
