Peter G. Bonebakker, 70, of Benicia, California passed away Friday, November 3 at home surrounded by the love of his family. He was born in Santa Barbara and called Benicia his home since 1995.

Pete graduated from the California Maritime Academy in 1968 and worked as a merchant mariner for more than 46 years. He earned his Unlimited Master's license in 1975 and sailed as Captain for almost 30 years. Pete ended his career working ashore for the Phillips 66 Co. as the West Coast Marine Terminal Advisor. He was actively involved in the maritime industry, serving on many boards and advisory committees which helped shape California's Maritime policy and standards.

In addition to his love of seamanship and navigation, Pete had a passion for cooking, always trying and improving new recipes. He enjoyed woodworking and most of all spending time with his family and friends. As one of his colleagues expressed, "Pete was the epitome of a professional mariner and the embodiment of a true friend to all."

Pete is survived by his wife, Susan, son Peter (Sara Bonebakker), daughter Catherine Bonebakker, brother Erno Bonebakker, sisters Helena Appleton and Connie Fuhrman, granddaughters Grace Elaine and Amelia Dawn Bonebakker. Pete, also, cherished his strong ties to all his nieces and nephews.

Memorial services will be held on Saturday, November 18, 2017 at one o'clock at Heritage Presbyterian Church, 1400 East Second Street, Benicia, California.

“ Peter was kind, generous, highly ethical, decent, and caring. I remember receiving a satellite call late one Friday evening from Captain Peter on the USNS YUKON as he was steaming to Sonderstrom, Greenland with a full load of JP-4 jet fuel and in a gale during 1985. He calmly told me (his boss at the time) that the rudder just fell off his ship. Calm and collected, I asked him to confirm visually this casualty. Peter had his crew hold the smallest crewmember by the ankles as they dangled him over the stern counter in darkness to confirm the casualty. We arranged to send a salvage tug and tow to Setubal, Portugal where Captain Pete oversaw the 55 day shipyard repair. Pete and I were class mates at California Maritime Academy (1965-1968) and if could be described in just one word, it would be 'Genuine'. His passing is a deep personal loss and our prayers to his entire family. His life was a life well-lived. Tom Stapleton
