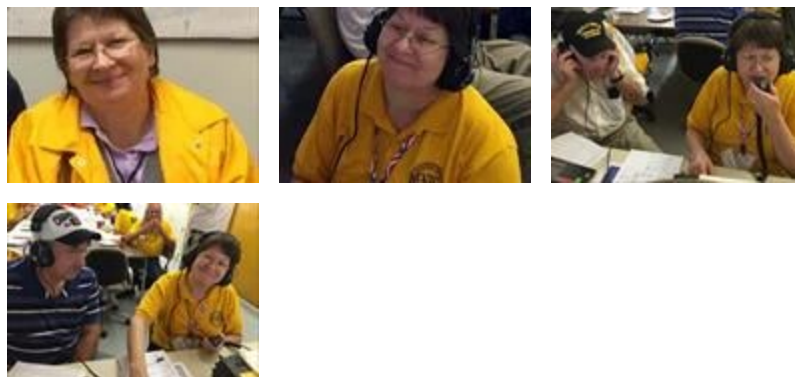

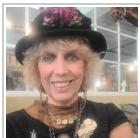
Sue and I are heartbroken. Andrea was such a joy to work with and be with. She was the key to our successful Ham Radio classes and she was a great friend.
