Other memories include when Geoff and Eric Yee would hang around in my apartment and we would watch one of Geoff's favorite old science fiction movies such as "This Island Earth" featuring one of Geoff's favorite monsters: The Metaluna Mutant. Speaking of the mutant there was the Halloween where I stood in a grocery store parking lot in San Francisco along with Eric and Geoff, who was wearing the Metaluna Mutant costume that Eric made for him. We were supposed to get a cab down to the Castro but we never got one so we made our way back to the east bay and hung out at a bar in Albany. Geoff never took off the mutant mask but he couldn't hear anyone trying to complement him on the costume. He would shout "What are they saying?" and I would shout back, "They like your costume!"*

Geoff was one of a kind. He was a real Renaissance man. He was A great librarian, a little bit of a curmudgeon, a lover of movies, a mystery author, and a guy who liked to dress up in goofy costumes and see what people made of him.

I hadn't talked to him in the last few years but I am very sad that he is no longer in the world. I will miss him greatly.
