Jackson R. McBride Jr., 96, of Benicia passed away Wednesday in a local hospital following a brief illness. He was born in Houston, Texas and has called Benicia his home for the past 10 years. Jackson worked as an Analyst and Industrial Engineer for ARAMCO, which took him to Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, in 1955. His young family followed in 1956. He returned to the United States in 1969, joining Bechtel Corporation, where he worked in International Compensation until his retirement.
