



Jean E. Fisher

March 31, 1939 - December 15, 2023

Jean Elizabeth Fisher died suddenly at Kaiser Hospital, San Rafael after a brief illness. Jean was born on March 31, 1939 to Dorothy and James Clarke. She was raised in San Francisco graduating from St. Paul's High School and San Francisco State College with BA in Political Science. After marrying Clark Fisher in 1961, she moved to Berkeley where she earned a Master's degree in International Relations. In 1968, she and Clark welcomed their son, Timothy, and shortly after moved to New York City where Jean earned a Doctorate in Neurology and Psychology from City University of New York. She used her knowledge of statistical analysis working for Pfizer for 17 on new drug studies. After she retired and her beloved husband died, she moved to Petaluma, CA, to be closer to her siblings and to be part of Petaluma's thriving artistic community to fulfill a lifelong dream of becoming a painter.

Jean was predeceased by her husband, Clark, and by her parents. She is survived by her son Tim, AKA TK Clarke, her grandsons, Spencer-John and Liam-Clive, her sister, Dorothy Reggiardo, her brother, James Clarke, as well as a niece, seven nephews and their families. She is also survived by her husband's cousin and friend, John Chambers, who was there for her when her health started to fail and she became ill. Lastly but not least she is survived by her beautiful Siamese cat, Sweetie, who only seemed to truly live up to her name when she was with Jean or Jean's housekeeper and friend, Marlies.
