One day in a casual conversation, I told him I'd never eaten as much lobster as I wanted to in one sitting/never been "stuffed". Shortly afterwards he took me to a local fresh fish market and we bought a "bunch" of lobsters to cook the next day. At dinner the next day, I ate until I couldn't hold another bite/was "stuffed"!
