I would get to know Maureen years later mostly during our Westchester High School years and primarily through the A Cappella Choir aka “Woody’s Choir”. I still vividly remember Maureen’s beautiful show voice in her stellar performance as “Marian, the Librarian” in *The Music Man*. I can recall her singing “Goodnight My Someone” and “Till There Was You.” In my mind I can still hear her lovely voice. In my opinion, she became the new standard for the role, surpassing, though still outstanding, Shirley Jones.

While we weren’t the closest of friends, I consider her to be a good friend and we frequently chatted small talk while in high school. In post high school years I did manage a great date with her while I was home (Los Angeles) during the summer in between school years while I attended Brigham Young University (Provo). Although I attended BYU, Maureen and my dad have something in common- USC alumni (and both now having passed away; my dad just last August).

My sympathy and empathy goes out to all of Maureen’s family, her students, students’ families, and other friends. Maureen joins the growing list of persons I love who have passed through the veil, my dear friend and also “Woody Choir” member Jeff Dial, Woody (Robert Wood), himself, and Sam Uskovich who was heavily involved in nearly all the high school musical productions, and others, all of whom I hope to see again.
