



Max H. Schwarz

Maximilian H. "Max" Schwarz, 96, died peacefully last Friday in a Sacramento hospital. He was born in Park, Kansas, one of thirteen children, and has lived in Sacramento for over 63 years. He worked as a Budget Analyst for the United States Government for more than 40 years before retiring in 1983.

He was a veteran of both the United States Army during World War II from 1942 to 1946 and United States Air Force in 1951.

Max was a member of Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish; the Knights of Columbus, and a former member of the Jesuit High School Boosters. Max was very involved with the Boy Scouts of America. He was a member of the Golden Empire Council; a Vigil member of the Order of the Arrow, and was a Silver Beaver Award recipient.

Max is survived by Marie, his loving wife of 66 years, sons Paul (Gail), and Richard (Diane) Schwarz; sister Ida Pace; grandchildren Adam (Shastina), Kevin (Rochelle), Alexander, Leanne (Kenney), Laura & Ryan; great granddaughter Adelina, and one on the way.

Recitation of the Rosary will begin at 10:30 a.m., Friday, followed by a Mass of Christian Burial at 11:00 a.m. at St. Dominic's Church, 475 East "I" St., Benicia. Burial will follow in St. Dominic's Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, family
