Omar D. Gonzalez, 94, of Benicia passed away peacefully Tuesday at his home. He was born in Torreon, Coahuila, Mexico and lived in Vallejo for many years before calling Benicia his home for the past 15 years. He worked as a machinist at Mare Island Naval Shipyard for almost 25 years before retiring in 1988.

In 1946, at age 18 years old, he was the swimming champion of the state of Nuevo León in Mexico. He came to the United States February 30, 1947. Omar was a veteran of the United States Marine Corp during the Korean War.

His favorite activities were fishing, dancing, and was a big soccer fan.

He is survived by his life partner Norma Macdonald; his children Omar F.
