It is with profound sadness to announce the passing of Susan Lynn on June 8, 2024 at the age of 78, surrounded by her loving and devoted friends and family. Susan was the first born to Jack and Ruth Jawetz in Manhattan, New York, 1945 and spent her formative years in Queens, New York. Succeeding a BA at Ithica College, Susan went on to achieve a Masters in Speech Therapy under a full scholarship at University of Wisconsin-Madison. After relocating to 6 different cities and birthing two children in 9 years, Susan made her home in Benicia for the last 50 years.
