



## Timothy "Red Dog" Vogelpohl

Timothy "Tim" Vogelpohl, affectionately known as "Red Dog," passed away peacefully at his home in Medford, Oregon, on June 20, 2026, at the age of 74. He was born on August 1, 1951.
